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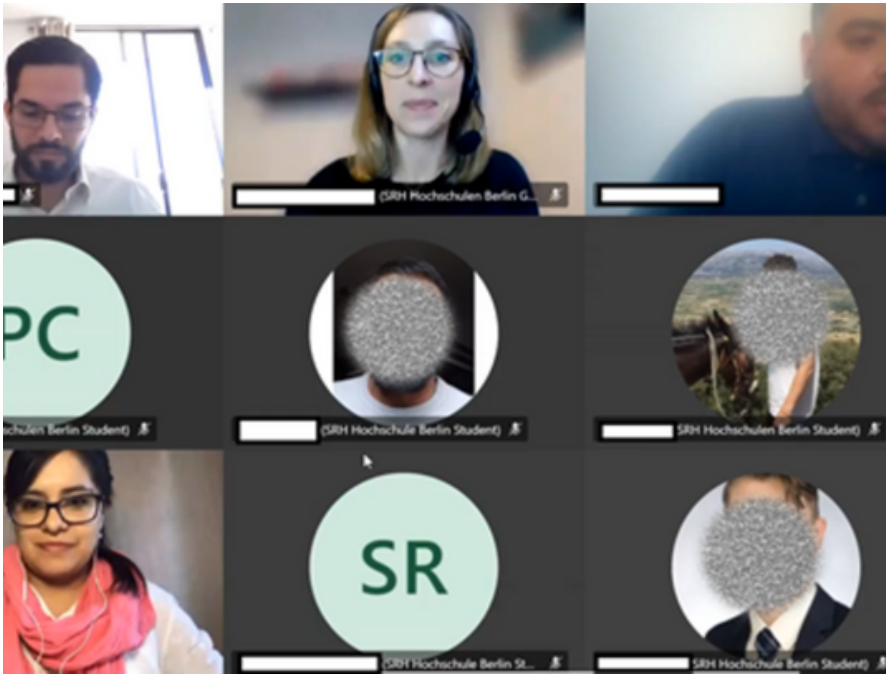
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PROJECT RECAP

Pilot project GLOBAL CLASSROOM with the Mexican partner university Tecnológico de Monterrey

In the winter semester 20/21, the SRH Berlin started an innovative, digital and international teaching project within the course "Risk Management in Financing" which is part of the International Management master study programme.

Students of both universities participate in the GLOBAL CLASSROOM for specific assignments and tasks that are offered by one lecturer from the SRH Berlin and two professors from Tecnológico de Monterrey.

The project is strongly practice-oriented and focuses on a real case study where students work in mixed teams of 3 to 5 members.

What are the goals of the project?

Development of critical thinking and decision-making skills, acquisition of a global perspective, communication skills and cooperative collaboration.

SOUNDTRAP - IVAC course in the field of music production with the SRH Berlin School of Popular Arts (SOPA) and the University for the Creative Arts (UCA), UK

Launched in November 2020, the project foresees the use of the platform "[Soundtrap](#)" to produce music together, digitally and simultaneously. The courses involved are "Project Management" in Audio Design (Laura Lee), "Music Production" (Daniel Schmuck) at SoPA and "Music Composition and Technology" at UCA.

The pilot phase of the project started on the 1st of November 2020 and will end with the summer semester 2021. The participating students of both universities are divided into small groups, each with a topliner, producer and lyricist. Together, the songwriting teams use the online DAW (Digital Audio Workstation) Soundtrap to produce music in synchronous sessions.

What are the goals of the project?

The aim of this collaborative experience is to gain intercultural skills through digital tools. In addition, students apply what has been learned in the course and deepen their knowledge and skills.

The exchange not only allows students to learn from each other in terms of core competencies in composing, arranging, writing and producing, but also to adapt different cultures and styles to each other. The aim is to create a creative network beyond national borders.
